- decided to make a new will, leaving all his bits of things to whomever he would be living with when he died / decided to make a new will / Change it as daughters did not deserve anything.
(any other appropriate point)

e) POETRY – NOT MARBLE, NOR THE GILDED MONUMENTS

Value Points:

- Time is sluttish because it waits for none. / Time spares none. / not true to anyone

- Everything is destroyed with the passage of time, including material objects.
(any other appropriate point)

- They were physically and mentally exhausted.

IMPORTANCE OF THE DIARY

Value Points :

- received on her birthday / called it 'Kitty'.
 - She had no friends so opened her heart to the diary.
 - described experiences of friends, academics, parents etc.
 - recorded fears, anxieties and hopes, took up complicated and difficult issues
 - a record of two years of Anne's life
 - described her struggle to define herself
 - Her diary became her confidante.
 - analyzed her own feelings and capabilities as a writer
 - traced the stages in her maturity
 - debated on deeper thoughts about humanity
- (any five points or any other appropriate point)

OR

CHARACTER SKETCH OF MR. DUSSEL

Value Points :

- a dentist
 - eighth person to join the Annexe
 - shared room with Anne
 - felt he knew everything
 - was a source of annoyance for his personal hygiene habits / pedantic lectures
 - never liked to be contradicted
 - created misunderstanding between Anne and her mother
 - was petty and officious
- (any five points or any other appropriate point)

OR

THE FROST KING

Value Points :

- Helen had written a story, ‘The Frost King’ and sent it to Mr. Anagnos at Perkins Institute.
- Mr. Anagnos published it and it turned out to be a plagiarized story.
- Court questioned Helen.
- Incident was traumatic.
- lost friendship of Mr. Anagnos
- shattered and tormented
- It was a big setback and an important episode in her life.
(any five points or any other appropriate point)

OR

HELEN AS AN INQUISTIVE CHILD

Value Points :

- child prodigy, willing to learn new things, inquisitive since childhood
- liked to discover new things
- curious about things around her, wanted to touch and explore them
- very energetic, never idle even for a moment
- Her lessons never tired her.
- varied interests
- could assess if her mother was going out by simply touching her attire
(any five points or any other appropriate point)
